The Digital Public Library of America (dp.la) lets readers search libraries, archives and museums full of information that you can search by subject, a time line, languages and even by color!

This collection of online information is vast and excites us with endless possibilities. But we all have a social nature that benefits from coming to the library. One of the benefits of engaging in NWPL activities is socializing and to get a deeper sense of belonging to a community.

The library used to be a place where you simply check out a book, find quiet study space, or acquire needed information. While these opportunities continue, now there is more. You can come to the library for an experience. Speak with a librarian who offers reader advisory services and can help you find your next pageturner. Join other families engage in story hour, take part in lively discussions in classics book discussions, author readings, classes or a wide variety of programs.
