
## What's On Your Nightstand Book Recommendations 2/8/22

**Ghost - Dolly Alderton** - funny and tender, filled with whip-smart observations about relationships, family, memory, and how we live now





Mind of Winter - Laura Kasischke - thirteen years ago, Holly and her



**Overstory - Richard Powers** - story woven together from many people's experiences about the environmental impact of clear cutting forests








