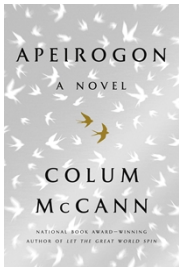
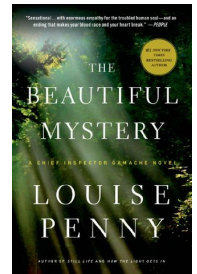


What's On Your Nightstand Book Recommendations for March 2022

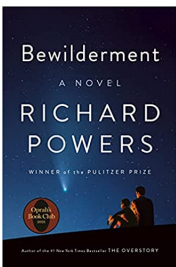


FICTION

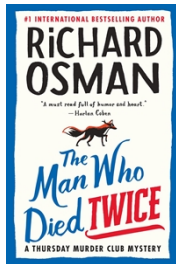

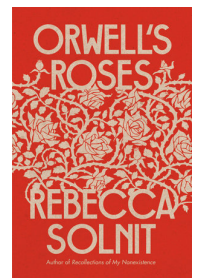

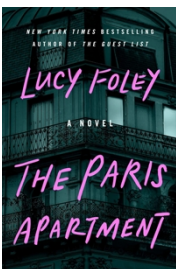
