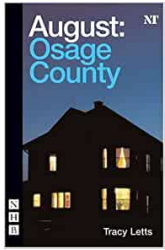

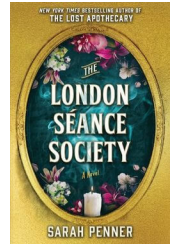

### FICTION

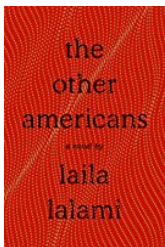
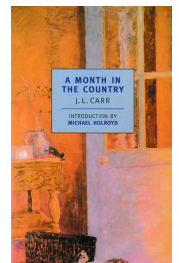
**August - Osage County by Tracy Letts** - a play portraying a dysfunctional American family at its finest—and absolute worst

**The Measure by Nikki Erlick** - Question: Would you choose to find out the length of your life?

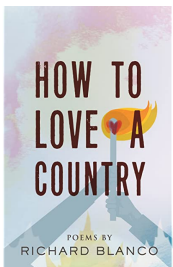
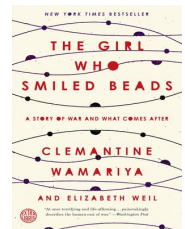
