FINANCIAL RECAP

Thanks in large part to the generous support of our donors, the library is in good financial shape. The following is a high-level unaudited summary of the financial status of the library for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023.

The operating expenses for the library for the fiscal year were \$582,000. The largest operating expense was for salary and related costs which accounted for 70% of the total. Other expenses were for books and related media, utilities and maintenance, and normal office expenses.

Funding for operations came from the fall and spring appeals (30%), the Town of Woodstock (35%), and the remainder from various sources (including books sales, a restricted gift to fund book purchases, grants, and income from the library's endowment).

On June 30, 2023, the library's endowment, and related funds ear-marked for major repairs and maintenance projects, stood at \$3.2 million.


