






What's On Your Nightstand






Held by Anne Michaels - An intensely beautiful narrative spanning four generations of connections and consequences that ignite and reignite as the century unfolds





Horse by Geraldine Brooks - A discarded painting in a junk pile, a skeleton in an attic,








Still Life by Sarah Widman - The story celebrates the myriad ways love is expressed and families are formed.




