


## **FICTION**




Covenant of Water by Abraham Verghese - A saga of love, faith, and medicine, following three generations of a family seeking the answers to strange secrets.




**Empty Theatre** by **Jac-Jemc** - Reimagining the mad misadventures of the iconic royal cousins King Ludwig and Empress Sisi.










Heaven and Earth Grocery Store by James McBride - Small town secrets... how much the people who live on the margins of white Christian America struggle and what they must do to survive.



Albert Camus - A deep dive into: journals, *The Stranger*, *The Fall*, and *The Plague* 








**Coming Into The End Zone** by **Doris Grumbach** - With the advent of her seventieth birthday, the author writes an account of everything she observes over the course of a year.
