

## WHAT'S ON YOUR NIGHTSTAND Book Discussion April 2025


*Held* by **Ann Michaels** - A narrative that spans four generations of connections and consequences that ignite and reignite as the century unfolds.

**We Begin at the End** by **Chris Whitaker** - An extraordinary novel about two kinds of families—the ones we are born into and the ones we create.




**The Things They Carried** by **Tim O'Brien** - A ground-breaking meditation on war, memory, imagination, and the redemptive power of storytelling.





new life to the well-known literary personages who were once considered avantgarde, bohemian types, at odds with the establishment.




**Around the World in 80 Books** by **David Damrosch** - Travel the world while sitting in your armchair by exploring eighty exceptional books from around the globe.





Cap Pistols, Cardboard Sleds and Seven Rusty Nails: A Vermont

**An Unfinished Love Story** by Doris Kearns Goodwin - One of America's most revered historians artfully weaves together biography, memoir, and history.




